Treaties Recognition Week This annual week-long event honours the importance of treaties and helps students and residents of Ontario learn more about treaty rights and relationships. By learning more about our collective treaty rights and obligations, we can create greater understanding and nurture relationships between Indigenous and non-Indigenous peoples.

Veterans Week 2023 marks the 75th anniversary of United Nations peacekeeping. Canada has a long history of helping defend and maintain peace around the world. More than 125,000 Canadian Armed Forces members have served in international peacekeeping efforts in dozens of countries. We recognize and remember their courage, service and sacrifice.

National Indigenous Veterans Day is a memorial day observed in Canada in recognition of Indigenous contributions to Military Service. Throughout Canada's history, Indigenous people have played a crucial role in the defence of Canada. More than 12,000 Indigenous men and women have served.

Email Notifications - School Cash Online & Lunchbox



We have heard there are issues with parents no longer receiving emails from SchoolCash Online when new events, or fundraisers at the school are created. There was a government directive where companies are no longer allowed to "spam" families with unwanted emails. Because of this, parents now need to enable email notification to be sent from SchoolCash Online.


For parents to enable the notifications they **do not** have to delete their students and re-add them. Please have your parents complete the following steps should they choose to received email notifications.

- 1. Log into SchoolCash Online
- 2. Selected My Account on the right
- 3. Select Manage Email Notifications
- 4. Ensure there is a check mark in the "I want to receive notifications....."
- 5. Then click change.

Parents will then start to receive email notifications from SchoolCash online. The same process will need to be done in Lunchbox to receive email.
